

# REGISTRARS, SIERRA LEONE

On behalf of the Department for International Development (DFID), we are seeking to appoint two Registrars to work with the Sierra Leone Judiciary as part of the Justice Sector Development Programme. There is one post of Registrar, Judicial Affairs and one post of Registrar, Finance and Administration.

The Justice Sector Development Programme contributes towards establishing safety, security and access to justice for the people of Sierra Leone, especially the poor, the vulnerable and the marginalised. The programme, in conjunction with the government of Sierra Leone, is helping to improve the performance of major sector institutions, policies and practices by means of a variety of interventions including training, mentoring, administrative reform and strategic planning.

For both posts you will have: a university degree in law or other relevant legal qualifications; at least ten years' relevant experience (for the Finance and Administrative post the relevant experience must be in accountancy and public administration); excellent communication skills, including experience of report writing; knowledge of electronic management; and computer skills. It is desirable that you have experience of working or living in a developing country, especially West Africa.

You will be expected to be resident in Sierra Leone for the duration of the contract, which is for ten months in the first instance, with a possibility to extend pending a review in January 2007.

Where possible applications should be returned via e-mail. Interviews will be held week beginning 17 April 2006, with an anticipated start date in May 2006.
